

# Lewis and Clark Legacy Forward

## 2007 Summer Institute for Teachers

**Featuring:** “Lewis & Clark—Then and Now”

**Dates:** Thursday – Sunday, June 21-24, 2007

**Focus:** A summer institute replicating Corps of Discovery experiences of 1803-1806 and introducing classroom experiences for carrying the Lewis and Clark Legacy forward. Introducing standards-based multidisciplinary classroom experiences applicable at all levels K-12 with emphasis on geography (mapping), history (timelines), citizenship (leadership), ethnic sensitivity (cultures/roles), first-person re-enactors and reflective journaling.

**Time:** A 4-day interactive, fun-packed classroom and community experience with working lunches, dinners and travel time and face-to-face sessions with outstanding presenters and teachers.

**Location:** Anchor activities on the campus of Indiana University Southeast in New Albany and Study Trips and other events spread throughout the Falls of the Ohio region in Indiana and Louisville, Kentucky.

**Description:** The Legacy Forward Committee, formed by the Indiana Lewis and Clark Commission, aims (1) to maintain the expedition legacies of two hundred years ago recently revived during the last three years; (2) retain the excitement and lessons in leadership, citizenships, survival skills, courage and ethnic sensitivity; and (3) to promote all with classroom applications for the future. Participants will meet fourteen hours daily for class and field work and, thus, are encouraged to take advantage of the reduced motel rate and supplied meals. A small stipend of \$50 to offset expenses will be supplied to the first 20 qualified applicants.

**Registration, Fees and Services:** All educators are encouraged to register for a minimal registration fee of \$100 which will be matched by the Commission. Graduate participants may opt for up to three credit hours at their own expense (\$203.23 per credit hour/special fees for Indiana residents and Kentucky reciprocity students). The Lewis and Clark Summer Institute offers 23 CRU's for the entire series. Anyone interested in obtaining the CRU's, will need to fill out the sign-up sheet provided on the first day of the Institute. Hotel costs will be approximately \$40-\$60 nightly per shared room night. Most meals, all entrance and tour fees, van transportation and materials packets will be provided.
