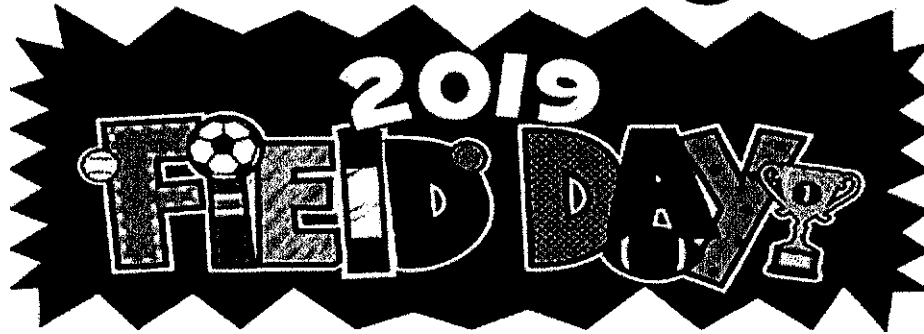

## Prom Regulations

Prom and after-prom are both school-sponsored events, and as such follow the regulations in the Lanesville Jr/Sr High School handbook. Examples of these regulations are as follows:

- No weapons, alcohol, tobacco, and drug products or paraphernalia allowed on the premises.
- Attendees must be at least sophomores in high school and no older than 20.
- Attendees are not allowed to be intoxicated at prom.
- Attendees can be searched/tested for weapon, drug, alcohol, and/or tobacco use if reasonable suspicion of use or possession is present. Examples of testing/searching include but are not limited to use of a breathalyzer, metal detector, and physical search of person (as outlined in 2018-2019 student handbook).
- For student safety, students will **not** be allowed to leave and re-enter Prom. Our School Resource Officer will be present to help ensure safety as well.
- Only those who have purchased a ticket or are currently enrolled as seniors at Lanesville Jr/Sr High are allowed to enter the prom venue. Guests from other schools will need to have a separate form filled out and on file with Lanesville Jr/Sr High before May 11, 2019.



## TACOU (Take A Course On Us) Discount – \$50 Course for High School Students

**Description:** While in high school, students can take a course on the campus of Ivy Tech Community College - Sellersburg at a special discounted rate.

### **Benefits:**

- Gain experience on a college campus
- Take a college course that may not be offered at the high school
- Help fulfill requirements towards completion of the STGEC or AGS
- Get ahead on future college or workforce related goals

### **Details:**

- The discount is for any student who is currently in an Indiana high school served by Ivy Tech Community College – Sellersburg.
- The charge is \$50 plus the cost of books/materials for any three credit hour (or fewer) course being offered in a given semester.
- **A student can choose any course for which they have met the pre-reqs.**
- The course must be a face-to-face course (on-campus).
- The student can only use this discount for ONE three credit hour (or fewer) course per semester.
- The student cannot register themselves. They must make an appointment to meet with someone from the Dual Credit office (see contact information below) who will register the student and also be their advisor while the student is in high school.
- This discount is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Terms and conditions could vary each semester.

  - Registration opens March 18, 2019. Appointments can be made after this date.
  - The 2019 **Summer** term begins June 10<sup>th</sup> 2019 and runs 8 weeks until August 3<sup>rd</sup> 2019.
  - The 2019 **Fall** term begins August 26<sup>th</sup> 2019 and runs until December 20<sup>th</sup> 2019.

# HCCF makes early education available

Giving children high-quality educational experiences in their early years is vital. According to "Early Care and Education: The Economic Case," the majority of brain growth occurs in a child's first five years of life, and that key time period cannot be replaced. Yet ironically, the least amount of public resources is applied to children during that time.

Children who participate in preschool are more likely to start kindergarten at the same level as their peers and have appropriate motor skills, social adaptation abilities and basic knowledge. Students who complete preschool are less likely to need special education or remediation services. Down the road, these children will be less likely to abuse drugs and alcohol, have babies while teenagers, or be incarcerated.

The Harrison County Community Foundation (HCCF) recognizes the need for change and has stepped up to address the problem in multiple ways.

HCCF is funding Jump Start, a pilot program that provides free, quality full-day preschool for income-eligible children in Harrison County. In many cases, these preschool students begin the year far behind their

peers in age-appropriate development.

Studies conducted by the IU Southeast Applied Research and Education Center using the ISTAR-KR (state-approved Kindergarten Readiness) assessment demonstrate some preschool students in the Jump Start program began the 2017-18 school year with development levels of less than a 25-month-old, so they were two years or more behind their peers.

Using the same assessment, at the end of the school year the students' reading and language development demonstrated an increase to within normal developmental range. This shows that with continued work, children in the Jump Start program can be completely on par with other students and ready for kindergarten.

Eligibility for Jump Start is based on the student's age and family income. Children entering the program need to be 4 years old by Aug. 1 and have a family income at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

Preschool providers participating in Jump Start include: Corydon, Heth-Washington, and South Central elementary schools; Blue River

Services, which provides preschool at Morgan and North Harrison elementary schools and Corydon Rainbow's End; and St. John's Lutheran School, St. Joseph Catholic School and Unity Chapel's Noah's Ark.

HCCF is also the sponsoring agency in Harrison County for an additional preschool program, On My Way Pre-K (OMWPK). OMWPK is funded by Indiana's Family and Social Services Administration. Families are eligible for this program when their 4-year-olds live in a household at or below 127 percent of the FPL and have parents or guardians who are working or attending school.

The OMWPK program includes before- and after-school childcare and summer care in addition to preschool. Families must apply online at [onmywayprek.org](http://onmywayprek.org). River Valley Resources will contact the family and determine eligibility.

If a family is not eligible for OMWPK, the family should contact HCCF at 812-738-6668 for assistance with Jump Start Preschool. Enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year is underway. Help us spread the word so more children can get free high-quality preschool and a "jump start" on education.

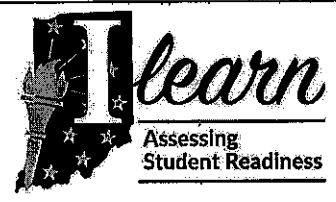

# ILEARN Assessment Information for Families



## 5 Key Points for Families to Understand About Indiana's New Assessments



*"Educator-Created; Student-Centered"*

### 1. What is ILEARN?

ILEARN is Indiana's new online computer-adaptive assessment designed to measure your child's proficiency of the Indiana Academic Standards in Grades 3–8, Biology and U.S. Government. ILEARN fulfills both state and federal legislative requirements as the accountability assessment for Indiana students.

ILEARN English/Language Arts	Grades 3–8
ILEARN Mathematics	Grades 3–8
ILEARN Science	Grades 4 and 6
ILEARN Social Studies	Grade 5

### 2. What is a computer-adaptive assessment and how does it benefit my child?

Computer-adaptive assessments adapt to each student's mastery of the content throughout the assessment. Every time a student answers a question, his or her response helps determine the next question presented. **The difficulty of the test will adjust to each student's skills**, providing a better measure of what each student knows and can do.

### 3. How does ILEARN support all students?

The new online testing system is easy to use and is more accessible to students who require features or accommodations while testing. New tools and resources are available to help students show what they know.

- Built-in glossaries allow students to select unfamiliar words and read their definitions. Glossaries are available in English, Arabic, Burmese, Mandarin, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
- Students are provided with authentic tools, such as spell check, a dictionary, and a thesaurus for use when responding to the writing task.
- The Desmos calculator (provided for Mathematics Grades 6–8) is available for students to practice using free of charge at: [desmos.com](https://www.desmos.com).
- Spanish translations (stacked over the English version) are available for Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

### 4. What resources are available to help prepare my child for ILEARN?

### 5. When will I receive score reports about my student's performance on ILEARN?

- Schools can access final scores and score reports on August 15, 2019 in the Online Reporting System. Beginning in 2019–20, reports will be available to schools within 12 days of students testing.
- Reports provide a scale score as an indication of overall student achievement in a grade level, as well as several subscores.
- Parents and guardians may request rescoring of open-ended items through the local school.
