## **Reach for the Stars Results - A Message from Ms. Beckort**

Thank you to everyone for a wonderful Reach For the Stars, RFTS, fundraiser this year. We collected \$10,623 in pledges and the students read 60,578 minutes. Students selected over \$8000 in free Usborne Books this week at the book fair, 80% of their pledge totals. Classroom teachers were able to select free books totalling 10% of their classroom pledge totals. We also sold another \$1000 in books to students not participating in RFTS and staff members. Our winning classrooms were: Highest Average of Minutes Read- Mrs. McLane's 6th grade class and Highest Average of Pledge Money collected- Mrs. Bryant's 1st grade class. Both classes will celebrate their achievement with a popcorn and movie party on Tuesday, November 22. The school will receive \$3,186.90 in cash to support our classroom and 10-10-10 challenge winners' celebrations and other future student activities.

This event would not be possible without the support of our Lanesville community. Including our many volunteers who help out. Jennifer Cortie and Ellie Brown with adding reading minutes and organizing reading logs into classes. We had 62 students who completed the 10-10-10 Challenge of collecting at least \$100 in pledges and reading at least 300 minutes. They will celebrate on Monday, November 21 with an ice cream sundae party.
