Families should have received their individual codes via email.


CAR RIDER LINE INFORMATION:



- When entering the parking lot (spot A), take turns with oncoming traffic.
- Do not stop in front of Elementary doors (spot B).
- Please pull all the way forward to the next available spot (think of this as a drive thru line). All the way up to right before the high school doors. (Spot C)
- Your child should be ready to get out of the car as soon as you stop (backpacks on, lunches and projects in hand, etc.).

 Say your goodbyes before your turn to unload this will help keep cars moving in line.

Parents are to remain inside their cars— do not leave car unattended.




PARENTSQUARE INFORMATION:

JOIN THE FUN! CUB SCOUT PACK 4025 GEORGETOWN, IN


