Student Drop off & Pick up

For the safety of students and staff we have set drop off and pick up procedures. AM Drop off – Between the times of 7:30 and 7:50, Jr/Sr High Students will need to be dropped off in parking lot, away from car rider line, and walk across the lot. No students are to be dropped off at the entrances of the school during this time due to the elementary car rider line. If students arrive at school after 7:55 a.m., they are considered tardy and must sign in at the office. 


