Student Drop off & Pick up

For the safety of students and staff we have set drop off and pick up procedures. AM Drop off – Between the times of 7:30 and 7:50, Jr/Sr High Students will need to be dropped off in parking lot, away from car rider line, and walk across the lot. No students are to be dropped off at the entrances of the school during this time due to the elementary car rider line. If students arrive at school after 7:55 a.m., they are considered tardy and must sign in at the office. PM Pick up – No students should be picked up at the front of the building during dismissal until the elementary car rider line has ended. After buses/car rider line drivers have left, students may be picked up at the school entrance. **Do not pick up or drop off your child at the curb near the main entrances when any buses are present before or after school.**

Lunches and Visitors to the building

Due to the large number of students in our lunches we do not allow parents/friends, etc to visit during lunch for grades 7-12. If you visit the building and are going past the front door for **ANY REASON, then YOU MUST sign in at the office.** You will be asked to provide the office with a state issued ID to be scanned and a visitor sticker printed. This sticker should be worn at all times while in the building.

From the Nurse:

We will no longer be administering a school supply of Ibuprofen, Tylenol, or Tums. We have had an extreme increase in students wanting to take meds. A phone call home for permission to give meds will no longer occur. Attached is the medication form. 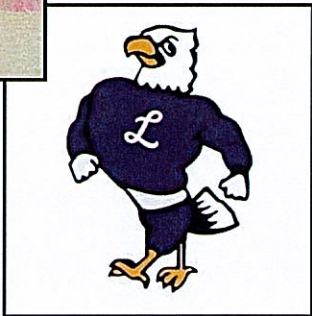

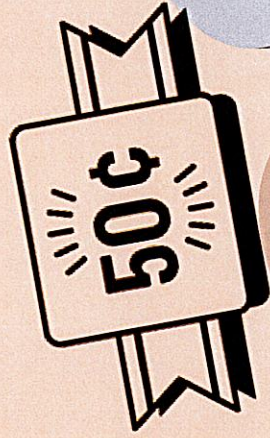

Dear Parents/Guardians:

This correspondence provides an update for our weather-related e-learning plans for the current school year. Schools are now limited to where teachers can post assignments for students to work on during the day. The first two snow days teachers will post their assignments by 9:00 am. Snow days three + will feature e-learning with live instruction on the schedules listed below.

Snow Days 1 & 2: Teachers will post assignments by 9:00 am and be available for questions and communication between 9:00 - 2:00. Students will have three days to complete assignments upon their return to school.

Other Information:

*As in the past, Lanesville will only use two e-learning days in a row. If we miss three consecutive days, the third day will be made up in person

*Students without internet access may turn in their work up to three school days upon returning to school for evidence of attendance.

*On a two-hour delay, the start of your child's day will be moved back exactly two hours. Lunch times will be the same, but no breakfast is served. If a two-hour delay occurs on a Friday, there is no early dismissal.

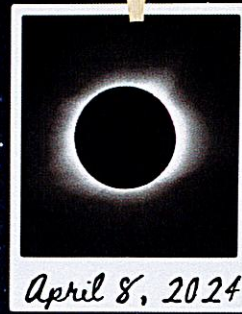

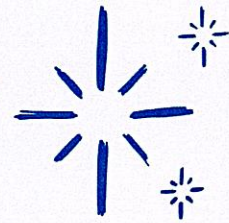
